The Complete Denture Evaluation Criteria

This examination tests candidates in the area of complete dentures. The complete denture evaluation is comprised of three distinct and separate sections. These are:

1. Laboratory Criteria
2. Clinical Criteria
3. Treatment Planning, Patient Records, and Clinical Presentation Criteria

Treatment Plan and Patient Records

The treatment plan should be prepared prior to the exam, and must be provided to the examiners for scoring **prior to beginning any intra-oral work**. Candidates should read and be familiar with the requirements for the treatment plan. The treatment plan must meet the standards established by the Bylaws section 71(1)(j).

The patient records must meet the requirements of section 74 of the Bylaws of the College of Denturists of British Columbia.

Weighting for Laboratory Criteria

<i>Final Impressions</i>	40%
<i>Artificial Tooth Arrangement</i>	<u>40%</u>

Weighting for Clinical Criteria

<i>Clinical Appearance</i>	20%
<i>Centric Occlusion</i>	40%
<i>Centric Relation</i>	<u>40%</u>
	100%

Weighting for Treatment documentation

<i>Treatment Plan</i>	50%
<i>Patient Records</i>	<u>50%</u>
